<u>COMMUNITY PLAYGROUND-RAISING APRIL 18-21.</u> Between Apr. 18 and 21, the Fairlington community will transform 21,000 linear feet of wood, 245 tons of stone, 166 tires and a large supply of hardware into a school playground unlike any you remember from your own school days. <u>How much</u> we build depends on you! Our architect, Robert Leathers, has said we need to fill a minimum of 1200 four-hour shifts to build our playground. Although the community's response has been encouraging, we still need to fill 450 four-hour shifts if we are to build all parts of the playground. We need men and women for all time periods. Our greatest needs are: Thurs. and Fri. from 4 p.m. until dark (including those who can join us for dinner and come after work); Sat. morning and Sun. morning. If you have not already volunteered--or if you have and can add another four hours--please call Barbara Effron at 931-6186.

Our unique design features castles, mazes, slides, swings, horizontal bars, special features for toddlers, and a host of other activities to delight and challenge children of all ages. It will be constructed at Abingdon Elem. School and will be available to the entire community.

The playground will include ONLY what we can build from April 18-21. We'll start building each day at 7:30 a.m., continuing into the evening. We're hopeful that each volunteer can help for at least 4 hours. To ensure that your favorite part of the playground will be built, please call Barbara Effron at 931-6186 to volunteer.

Bring your kids to our free Day Camp. We're having a great program for the children so all parents can help us build. It will be staffed by recreation specialists from Arlington County and volunteer parents, and will be available from 7:30 a.m. each day of the playground-raising. There will be an organized schedule of crafts, movies, sports, games, and meals.

For children under 3, we'll arrange for child care in the homes of parents in your neighborhood--just tell us each child`s name and age when you call to volunteer.

<u>A "Gourmet" Playground</u>. You'll work up a great appetite building the playground, so we've arranged for wonderful meals, including donations from Peking Gourmet Inn, Casa Maria, Heavenly Gate, T.G.I.Fridays, The Pawn Shop and other restaurants in addition to the specialties of your neighbors! We'll also have a great supply of drinks and snacks to keep you going between meals.

<u>Even if you don't have children</u>, this is an unusual opportunity to join with your neighbors for fun, food, and fitness. Come for the fun and for the satisfaction of making a major contribution to your community.
